Letter "A" Lesson Plan

MAKE THE LETTER

Do uppercase for week 1 and lowercase for week 2 or throughout the 2 weeks as desired. See Letter Activities Samples on pg. 7-8 of the Intro to Toddler Curriculum file or a sample photo of the activity

- Salt Tray

LEARNING NOTEBOOK (PG. 5-15)

Do one page a day for weeks 1 and 2

TODDLER TRAY (PRINTABLES ON PG. 3)

Theme: Draw an apple on white styrofoam, Push golf tees into Styrofoam to cover the apple drawing.	Matching: Have 6 ping pong balls (2 red, 2 yellow, and 2 green) in a bowl. Match "apples" (ping pong balls) in same colored silicon cupcake liners.	Stickers/Stamps: Clip a cotton ball with a clothespin and use it as a paint brush to paint "apples" on a paper tree.	Fine Motor: Print a tree and tape to a pencil. Put in cup filled with glass gems so it stands up. Have small bowl with water and a water dropper. Use dropper to "water" tree.	Transferring: Use tongs to transfer red math cubes onto printed tree. One math cube goes on each dot. (see printable)

Sew an Apple

Instructions

MATERIALS NEEDED

- Red Construction Paper
- Yarn
- Hole Punch
- Sewing Stuffing
- Tape

DIRECTIONS

Fold a piece of red construction paper in half. Cut out a simple apple shape so you have two matching pieces. Punch holes all around the apple shape about 1/2" from the edge.

Cut a long piece of yarn and wrap tape around one end to make it stiff. Show your toddler how to sew through the holes in the apple. Have them sew around the apple until there are about 5-7 holes left.

Have your toddler stuff the batting into the apple to make it nice and plump. Once the batting is in, have them finish sewing around the apple. Tie off the sewing and cut off any extra yarn.

If you'd like, you can cut a brown or green "stem" to attach to the apple when finished.
